

Support and Funding of European Patient Advocacy Organizations

As part of Seagen's mission to make a meaningful difference to patients, we are proud to support patient advocacy organizations and related initiatives. We engage in collaboration and partnerships with patient organizations and provide funding through sponsorships, grants, and donations to support efforts that positively impact patients' lives.

Seagen provides funding to qualified recipients that support the needs of patients/patient advocacy organizations, to educate the public on cancer as well as other charitable causes, programs and activities that benefit patients. All sponsorships, grants and donations are compliant with applicable laws. In some cases, Seagen requires the expert advice of patient advocacy organizations with whom we contract with for their provision of specific services.

To provide context to each contribution to patient advocacy organizations and to make the data more meaningful to the general public, we share an additional level of detail for each contribution type including Grants or Charitable donations; Corporate sponsorships, In-Kind Donations or Services, and Consultancy and services fees:

- A Grant is an unsolicited fund provided by Seagen to support an independent, specific activity or program. Examples are patient education programs. Seagen has no control or influence on the activity.
- A Sponsorship is funding provided by Seagen, in exchange for a genuine tangible benefit, related to a commercial or corporate benefit opportunity.
- In-Kind Donation or Services are goods or services provided by Seagen and Seagen employees that constitute a transfer of value to an entity.
- Consultancy and service fees are fair market value remuneration provided to a patient advocacy organization for services provided to Seagen.
